

INSTALLATION

Sherwin-Williams High Performance Flooring materials shall only be installed by approved contractors. The following information is to be used as a guideline for the installation of the Resuflor Topcoat FX. Contact the Sherwin-Williams Technical Service Department for assistance prior to application.

SURFACE PREPARATION — GENERAL

Sherwin-Williams systems can be applied to a variety of substrates if the substrate is properly prepared. Preparation of surfaces other than concrete will depend on the type of substrate, such as wood, concrete block, quarry tile, etc. Should there be any questions regarding a specific substrate or condition, please contact the Sherwin-Williams Technical Service Department prior to starting the project. Refer to Surface Preparation Form G-1.

SURFACE PREPARATION — CONCRETE

Concrete surfaces shall be abrasive blasted to remove all surface contaminants and laitance. The prepared concrete shall have a surface profile equal to CSP 1-3. Refer to Form-G-1.

After initial preparation has occurred, inspect the concrete for bug holes, voids, fins and other imperfections. Protrusions shall be ground smooth while voids shall be filled with a system compatible filler. For recommendations, consult the Sherwin-Williams Technical Service Department.

TEMPERATURE

Throughout the application process, substrate temperature should be 60-90°F. Substrate temperature must be at least 5°F above the dew point. Applications on concrete substrate should occur while temperature is falling to lessen off gassing. The material should not be applied in direct sunlight, if possible.

PRIMER

MIXING AND APPLICATION

- Add 2 parts 3579A (resin) to 1 part 3579B (hardener) by volume. Mix with low-speed drill and Jiffy blade for three minutes until uniform. To ensure proper system cure and performance, strictly follow mix ratio recommendations.
- 2. 3579 may be applied via spray, roller or brush. Apply at a spread rate of 200 sq. ft. per gallon, evenly, with no puddles. Coverage will vary depending upon porosity of the substrate and surface texture.
- 3. Wait until primer is tacky (usually 1 hour minimum), before applying the base coat.

MEMBRANE

MIXING AND APPLICATION

- Premix 3555A (resin) using a low-speed drill and Jiffy blade. Mix for one minute until uniform, exercising caution not to whip air into the materials.
- 2. Add 1 part 3555A (resin) to 1 part 3555B (hardener). Mix with low-speed drill and Jiffy blade for three minutes until uniform. Apply material using a 1/4" v-notched trowel or 1/4" v-notched squeegee and backroll with a looped roller at a spread rate of 80 sq. ft. per gallon to yield 20 mils WFT.
- Allow to cure. (Cure times vary depending on environmental conditions.)

SEAL / FINAL COAT

MIXING AND APPLICATION

DO NOT PREMIX PART B HARDENER.

- Premix 4687A (resin) using a low-speed drill and Jiffy blade. Mix for one minute until uniform, exercising caution not to introduce air into the material.
- 2. Add 2 parts 4687A (resin) to 1 part 4687B (hardener) by volume. Mix with low-speed drill and Jiffy blade for three minutes until uniform. To ensure proper system cure and performance, strictly follow mix ratio recommendations.
- 3. Apply 4687 using a 1/4" nap roller at a spread rate of 250-400 square feet per gallon, evenly, with no puddles making sure of uniform coverage. Take care not to puddle materials and ensure even coverage. If a second coat is required, the surface must be abraded with 80-120 grit paper or screen and tack wiped prior to second application.
- 4. Allow to cure for 24 hours minimum before opening to traffic. In cool and/or high humidity conditions, a surface film may form which can be washed with soap and water.

For different optional seal coats, such as 4685 Poly-Cote, consult individual technical data sheet for mixing and application instructions.

APPLICATION EQUIPMENT BRUSH / ROLLER

Use 1/4" phenolic core rollers and professional quality, mediumstiff natural bristle brushes.

CLEANUP

Clean up mixing and application equipment immediately after use. Use toluene or xylene. Observe all fire and health precautions when handling or storing solvents.

SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

MATERIAL STORAGE

Store materials in a temperature controlled environment (50-90°F) and out of direct sunlight. Keep resins, hardeners, and solvents separated from each other and away from sources of ignition.
